1,500 Free Trees to be Planted in East Oakland Flatlands

OAKLAND, Calif. - The **Oakland Parks and Recreation Foundation** received a \$310,000 grant from the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) to plant 1,500 trees in the flatlands of East Oakland over the next three years. Its partners, **Keep Oakland Beautiful** (KOB) and the **Sierra Club Tree Team**, will coordinate tree locations and plantings.

“The CAL FIRE tree grant supports our beautification efforts in Oakland’s Flatlands,” said Aron Nussbaum, Board Chair, KOB. “As the city continues to grow and change, these trees will provide a foundation for our environmental programs.”

The grant will pay for trees in Oakland's Council Districts 2, 5, 6, and 7; locations below International Boulevard have the highest priority, especially those with room for trees that can grow to large size. Homeowners and other property owners can apply to receive one or more free trees along the sidewalk or in an unfenced front yard. Other public locations are eligible, such as parks, libraries, schools, or roadway medians.

Administered by CAL FIRE, the grant program distributes money from the state's Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund to projects in environmentally-disadvantaged communities, according to the CalEnviroScreen rating system. The primary purpose of the program is to absorb carbon dioxide as the trees grow, but the trees will also provide many other environmental and social benefits to the community.
